Delegation includes: Visits to workers' homes and communities in Ciudad Acuña, maquiladora industrial parks, Section 307 of the Mexican Miner's Union, Fair trade maquiladora in Piedras Negras (Dignity and Justice), Fuerza Unida and the Southwest Workers Union in San Antonio as well as good food, fellowship and fun.

The safety issue: Austin Tan Cerca is open to discussion of violence and safety at the border. Thanks to our relationships and partnerships in Piedras Negras and Ciudad Acuña, we have directly witnessed, over the past 11 years, that where and how we go to the border is safe. We persist in making our voices heard against the tide of news headlines and rumor that makes the danger out to be uniform, anywhere and everywhere in Mexico.
